### HISTORY OF AMHS

Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy High School opened in 1988 as Holy Cross High School in Everett, Washington. The school was founded as an independent Catholic high school through the vision and energy of a small group of parents committed to providing their children with a college preparatory Catholic education within the Everett community.

In 1999, the school moved to its current campus in the South Everett/Mill Creek area. At that time, the school's name was changed to Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy High School in honor of the late Archbishop Murphy, a strong supporter of the school in its early years. For 35 years, AMHS has served families in the North Puget Sound area as an approved Catholic school under the auspices of the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. AMHS is known for its faith-filled, rigorous college prep curriculum and supportive community atmosphere.

### MISSION STATEMENT

Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy High School is a Catholic, college preparatory school that welcomes students of all faiths. True to the spirit of the Gospel, Archbishop Murphy nurtures the full development of the gifts that God has given to each student, fosters service as an outgrowth of faith, and values diversity. Working with parents as partners in this educational ministry, we strive for academic excellence, spiritual enrichment, and Christlike leadership for the transformation of the world.

### STUDENT BODY

- In the provision of all student programs and services, AMHS provides equal access to admissions.
- For the 2024-25 school year, there are 479 students in grades 9 through 12.
- Approximately 60% of the student body is Catholic.
- Of the student body, 35% receive tuition assistance.
- The average class size is 16.9 students (Range = 3 to 26).
- In 2024, 100% of the senior class graduated.
- 90% of the 2024 Graduates are pursuing post-secondary education.

### FACULTY

At AMHS, we are proud of our faculty and their dedication to providing the best possible education to our students.

- There are 39 teaching faculty members; 85% have an advanced degree in their area of instruction; 5% have doctorates.
- The faculty/student ratio is 1:12.

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The school operates on an eight-period block schedule, with a two-day rotation. It includes an optional zero-period and a non-credit Community Period. Students must earn 28 credits to graduate.

### CLASS OF 2024 HIGHLIGHTS (92 GRADUATES)

- The average cumulative grade point for all four years was 3.52.
- 76% of the class graduated with Academic Honors (cumulative GPA higher than 3.2).
- 64% were members of the National Honor Society.
- 17 seniors received the Washington State Honors Award.
- Members of the class took a total of 131 Advanced Placement exams.
- 26 seniors were named as AP Scholars (8 with Honor, 13 with Distinction).
- The class achieved an average SAT score of 1222.
- The class had a 100% graduation rate and 90% of the class is pursuing post-secondary education (86% to four-year institutions, 4% to two-year institutions, and 10% to other).
- Members of the class were offered college merit scholarships and awards totaling over \$11.4 million (on average, \$113,500 offered per student).

## GRADING SYSTEM

It is important to note that Archbishop Murphy High School does not provide exact class rank. The AMHS grading scale is a means to communicate a student's level of individual accomplishment and should not be interpreted as a measure of intelligence or ability. ## CHRISTIAN SERVICE

- AMHS requires all students to participate in direct service to people in need by serving at approved sites, compiling their experiences in journals, and completing a major project in their senior year. Service hours required for graduation are:
  - All students must complete 25 hours of service each year.
- In the 2023-24 school year, AMHS students provided a total of 12,481 hours of service.

Since 2003, our students have taken 4,530 exams and 76.5% of these exams have received a score of "3" or higher, generating college credit. In 2024, 155 students took 288 exams with an average score of 3.3. 21 students earned the designation of AP Scholar, 17 of these with Distinction and 12 with Honor.

### MATTEO RICCI PROGRAM (HONORS)

The Matteo Ricci Program is an integrated study of Literature, Civics, Political Theory, Economics, Sociology, Philosophy and Theology credit is awarded from the Matteo Ricci College of Seattle University as follows:

- English 12H = 5 credits in Humanities 1850
- Social Science 12H = 5 credits in Humanities 1315
- Theology 12H = 5 credits in Humanities 2910

### HEALTH STUDIES PROGRAM

The Health Studies Program fosters student interest in both health and health services by enhancing student understanding of the healthcare field. Through a specialized curriculum, as well as experiential learning, it aims to cultivate respect for life and compassion for those in need.

### BUSINESS PATHWAYS PROGRAM

Committed to cultivating insight, the program enhances student understanding of business administration, marketing, finance, hospitality, and entrepreneurship through a specialized curriculum and experiential learning.

### ACADEMIC RESOURCE CENTER

The Academic Resource Center envisions that students who desire a Catholic education can access one and those students who have been diagnosed with a learning difference may be eligible to receive AMHS approved accommodations. Students receive structured assistance within a rigorous academic setting.
